"On 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2020 CCRC Chairman Helen Pitcher wrote to Sir Bob Neil to draw the attention of the Justice Select Committee to the CCRC's Post Office Horizon referrals and to suggest that, in light of them, it would be appropriate for there to be a formal review of the circumstances and safeguards where an organisation is allowed to act as a prosecutor when it is also the victim and the investigator of an alleged offence, as the Post Office was in these cases."
